R&R

RESCUE & RESUSCITATION at WILLIAMSTOWN. (Known as R&R)

Williamstown Open Ladies R&R team.

The team was bitterly disappointed that we could not compete at the Victorian titles at Lorne in March and the Aussie titles at Broadbeach, Queensland in April.

As previously advised this team started training on 1st June this year with Coach Max Collins once a week on the weekends. As it got warmer and closer to the first Surf Carnival the team

started training twice a week from late October. The second day was 6 am on Wednesdays.

Obviously with the many hours put in it was sad the Corona Virus wrecked all our plans and the U15, 5 person team were just as disappointed because they had been very successful at Victorian carnivals this season and were looking good to go better than the Bronze they won at the Aussies in 2019.





R&R

This coming season 2020/21 - COME AND HELP - COME AND JOIN IN.

It is also planned that one or 2 teams will compete in the Wanda NSW Carnival next year as a lead up to the Victorian State titles and then compete in the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships (Aussies) in Queensland in April next year.

For those who do not know, The Aussies are the largest competition event held in Australia and are held every year. They are even bigger than the Commonwealth Games in competitor's numbers. This will be the first time WS&LSC has ever competed in senior R&R at the Aussies.

However, to be competitive the teams will need to train up to 6 times a month in the last few months leading up to the Aussies, plus swimming training and complete their individual required Patrol Hours. Surf Life Saving is a unique sporting organisation in the fact that if Club members wish to compete in Surf Life Saving Carnivals, they must do so many hours per season before they can compete. Team members are dedicated Club Members

The Open Women's team are planning to compete at the Aussie Titles on the Sunshine Coast in April 2021 and the team is looking for any person or business who might consider becoming a Team sponsor to help the ladies get to Queensland then.

We will help anyone wanting to be a Victorian R&R judge and soon become an Accredited SLSA R&R Judge Official in the process.



For the uninitiated once again! RESCUE AND RESUSCITATION – what is it?

We call it the REEL Event in Surf Life Saving!

The R&R Competition is the oldest team event in the SLSA and is the only event in the completion field that allows lifesavers to practice, perfect and refresh the basic fundamentals of life saving skills.

R&R hand books can be traced back to 1907.



R&R is an event that enables both male and female members to compete together on equal terms and in the same team.

eg. U15, U19 & open male & open female in 5 person teams. The premier event is the OPEN 6 PERSON Team.

For Juniors and Youth, we have 2 Person R & R, in which competition is divided into U14/15, U12/13, U10/11, teams can be mixed or single sex. As of 2019 2 Person R & R is also an "Aussies event". The drill is broken down into 4 sections consisting of marching and wheeling, simulated rescue and respiratory assessment, CPR, and march off. WSLSC have a history of the past 3 years of winning the Junior/ Youth Team of the Year, and several gold, silver and bronze state championship medals.



Competing in R&R highlights the all-round ability of a practicing lifesaver and another event Williamstown can gain extra points in overall Club points score at Victorian Carnivals.

The development of R&R Teams at Williamstown will bring together a number of dedicated and conscientious members who otherwise may have drifted along as individuals and who do not stay in the club for the long term. (Years)

The team training in R&R really does foster a sense of responsibility and from those teams many clubs have fostered a future majority of efficient Club Officers & Patrol Captains.

Clubs across Australia have shown that the discipline necessitated by R&R team members has "rubbed off" on members throughout clubs and their experience, keenness, discipline and quick thinking makes them good patrol leaders and committee members.

R&R takes time, R&R takes effort! TRY R&R. results will not always be immediate as our open women team managed at Ocean Grove but end results will go to those who persevere in a great FUN event.


International Women's Day
